A global intergovernmental policy body on all types of forests

- In 2007, the Forum agreed on the UN Forest Instrument
- In 2017, the Forum agreed on the UN Strategic Plan for Forests 2030







About the UN Strategic Plan for Forests 2030

The Strategic Plan provides a **global framework for action** at all levels **to sustainably manage all types of forests and trees outside forests**, and **to halt deforestation and forest degradation**.

- was forged at a special session of the UN Forum on Forests in January 2017, and subsequently adopted by the UN General Assembly in April 2017.
- features 6 Global Forest Goals and 26 associated targets, which are voluntary and universal, to be achieved by 2030.
- serves as a reference framework for forest-related work within and beyond the UN system for enhanced coherence, collaboration and synergies.

- Mission: To promote sustainable forest management and the contribution of forests and trees outside forests to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, including by strengthening cooperation, coordination, coherence, synergies and political commitment and action at all levels.

Voluntary National Contributions (VNCs)

In accordance with paragraph 30 of the Strategic Plan, Member States may, on a voluntary basis, determine their contributions towards achieving the global forest goals and targets, taking into account their national circumstances, policies, priorities, capacities, levels of development and forest conditions. These "voluntary national contributions" or VNCs, may include national actions and targets related to other international forest-related commitments and goals, such as the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals, the Aichi Biodiversity Targets and actions to address climate change under the Paris Agreement under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

Since the adoption of the Strategic Plan in April 2017, an increasing number of countries have announced their VNCs towards achieving the Global Forest Goals and Targets. At its 13th session of the Forum in May 2018, Member States of the Forum requested the UNFF Secretariat to compile, in a publicly accessible and centralized repository, all announcements of the voluntary national contributions communicated to the secretariat. - Reverse the loss of forest cover worldwide through sustainable forest management, including protection, restoration, afforestation and reforestation, and increase efforts to prevent forest degradation and contribute to the global effort of addressing climate change.

Goal 1 targets include:

- Increase forest area by 3% worldwide by 2030, (an area of 120 million hectares).
- Maintain or enhance the world's forest carbon stocks by 2030.

- Enhance forest-based economic, social and environmental benefits, including by improving the livelihoods of forest-dependent people.

Goal 2 targets include:

- Eradicate extreme poverty for all forest-dependent people by 2030.
- Enhance the contribution of all types of forests to biodiversity conservation and climate change mitigation and adaptation by 2030

Goal 3 targets include:

Significantly increase the area of forests worldwide designated as protected areas or conserved through other effective area-based conservation measures by 2030.

Mobilize significant resources from all sources and at all levels to finance sustainable forest management and provide adequate incentives to developing countries to advance such management, including for conservation and reforestation, by 2030.




Goal 5 targets include:

Enhance forest law enforcement and governance, including through significantly strengthening national and subnational forest authorities, and significantly reducing illegal logging and associated trade worldwide, by 2030.

Goal 6 targets include:

Significantly enhance crosssectoral coordination and cooperation to promote sustainable forest management and halt deforestation and forest degradation at all levels by 2030.
